Durante ese tiempo, obispos, sacerdotes y líderes de la iglesia fueron arrestados y martirizados. Las iglesias fueron confiscadas, las comunidades desintegradas y la gente fue forzada a practicar su fe en secreto. A pesar de esta persecución religiosa, los fieles en Europa Central y Oriental hoy han reconstruido y renovado lo que ellos habían perdido—y también ustedes pueden ayudarlos.
